## Hamad bin Khalifa University and Partners Engage with Students and Families at HBKU Family Day

Doha, 5 February 2014 – Hamad bin Khalifa University (HBKU), a member of Qatar Foundation for Education, Science and Community development (QF), organized its 6<sup>th</sup> annual Family Day event for students of Education City and their families on January 30<sup>th</sup>. Qatar Foundation's Academic Bridge Program was also represented. The Universities allowed parents and students to interact and speak about learning both inside and outside the classroom.

"Family Day is not only a great way for families to learn about their student's day to day lives here in Education City," said Melissa Winter Jan, Assistant Director of Campus Life at HBKU, "but it is also an opportunity for students to further introduce to their families their community within Education City. With events that illustrate the academic exploration and knowledge growth that our universities are known for, and recreational activities that allow students and their families to create wonderful memories here together, this is one of our most widely enjoyed events."

Hamad bin Khalifa University strives to deepen the student learning experience and develop a dynamic campus community across traditional institutional boundaries, with its Student Center acting as an academic, social and recreational hub for all university students. During this year's family day event, HBKU and its partners organized a welcome booth in the Student Center to welcome families to the celebration, as well as a Student Affairs booth to further explain all of the services available to students in Education City. Families were also invited to participate in a chili cook-off, hosted by TAMUQ, and to challenge each other on obstacle course and carnival games organized by the HBKU Sports and Games Club. Fakhro, Campus Life Officer at HBKU said: "HBKU Family Day is one of multiple efforts by HBKU and its partner universities to engage with the families of the Education City student body.
