Doha, February 15 2014 –Qatar Green Building Council (QGBC) has announced its strategic membership of the International Sustainability Alliance (ISA) and will now offer organisations in Qatar the opportunity to become members and receive a host of benefits, including bespoke evaluations on the sustainability of their buildings.

ISA is a global networking organisation, dedicated to improving the sustainability of real estate through benchmarking. Its members include property owners, occupiers and investors who are then able to come together to share best practice in the sustainable management of their property portfolios in order to improve overall performance.

to future ventures. Members can also monitor improvements in environmental performance over time and against targets, allowing for on-going trend analysis.
