Eighty-four NU-Q Students Recognized for Academic Distinction

Doha, Qatar – November 11, 2017 – At a luncheon hosted by its dean, Northwestern University in Qatar (NU-Q) recognized the academic excellence of 84 students named to the Dean's List for the Spring 2017 semester.

"As an NU-Q student you have dealt with different factors across the programs, including different types of rigorous coursework, from essays and tests to research papers and documentary," said Everette E. Dennis, dean and CEO. "The work you have done here is among the best and I hope that you take the time to enjoy making the Dean's List and being recognized today as one of the best among the best."

To qualify for the Dean's List, media industries and technology majors at NU-Q achieve at least a 3.75 grade point average (GPA) for the semester, and journalism and strategic communication majors achieve a 3.7 GPA.
