Doha, Qatar – March 28, 2017 – Northwestern University in Qatar (NU-Q) has recognized a group of its students for their excellence in media and research at a recent ceremony held in Education City. The university's annual Media and Research Awards highlight students' successes in the areas of research, documentary, creative writing, fiction, news, and multimedia content.

"This is a chance for NU-Q students to have their academic and professional work—journalism, films, and research—assessed by outside experts who give them consistently high marks," said Everette E. Dennis, dean and CEO.

Prior to the awards ceremony, the university hosted a showcase of all nominees at the HBKU Student Center in Education City. All of the submissions were adjudicated by local and international industry leaders – many of whom were present at both events to recognize the efforts of the nominees.
